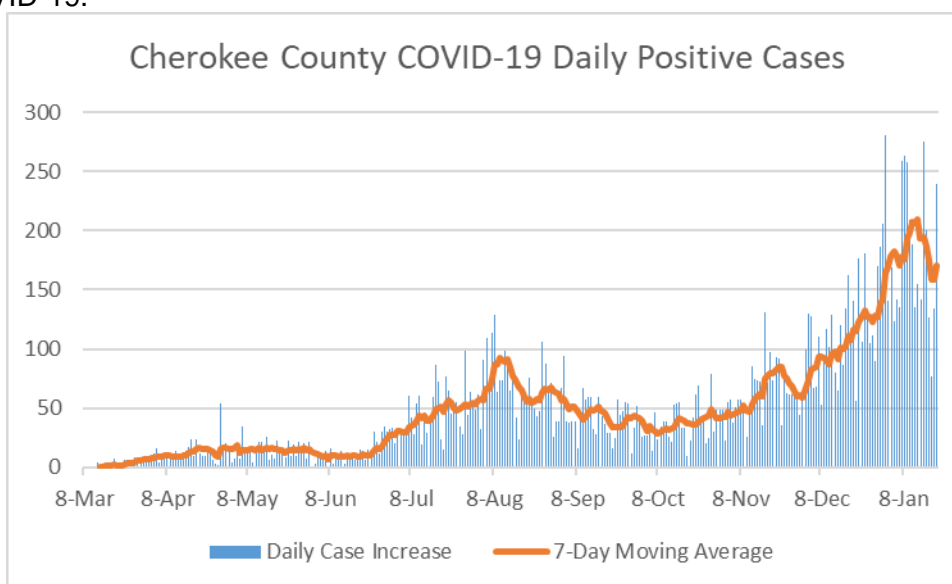


**CHEROKEE COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

DAILY UPDATE

- Cherokee County EMA and Board of Commissioners ask that you be mindful of your needed travels, contact with others, continue to practice social distancing, and practice good hygiene.
- The Georgia Department of Public Health has announced 695,400 confirmed cases of COVID-19 across the state.
- 11,411 deaths have occurred in the state as a result of COVID-19.
- Cherokee County has 16,495 confirmed cases of COVID-19, since March 8, 2020. This is an increase of 239 cases from the previous day.
- Cherokee County has one-hundred and sixty-eight (168) confirmed fatalities due to COVID-19.

- COVID-19 testing will now be administered by Mako Medical instead of Georgia Public Health. The new drive-thru testing site is located at First Baptist Church of Woodstock, in a parking lot adjacent to Gunnin Road. **Please note: entrance to the testing site will need to be made via Gunnin Road.** Hours of operations and pre-registration processes are listed below:
 - Days/Hours of Operation: Monday-Friday from 8:00 AM until 3:00 PM
 - You are only required to pre-register for your test. There are no set appointment times. As soon as you sign up for testing, you can arrive at the testing site any time between 8:00 AM and 3:00 PM that is convenient for you.

- Adults aged 65 years and older are included in Phase 1-A of the COVID-19 vaccination plan and eligible to receive the vaccine.

- The City of Woodstock has issued Executive order #2020-6 requiring citizens to wear face coverings when entering and inside city buildings. Please see <http://www.woodstockga.gov/> for further information.
- The Georgia Department of Public Health has established an Emotional Support Line. They will provide 24/7 free and confidential assistance to callers needing emotional support or resource information as a result of COVID-19. The number is 866-399-8938.
- The Cherokee County Aquatic Center has begun a phased reopening of its pools for the general public. Please contact the Aquatic Center for additional details at 678-880-4760.
- Cherokee Recreation and Parks Agency (CRPA) has announced that all playgrounds, pavilions, athletic fields, and the Skate Park are open, with restrictions. All park users must continue to abide by all CDC guidelines on social distancing, as well as gathering sizes as defined by Gov. Brian Kemp's Executive Order.
- Local parks and trails remain open to the general public. Please utilize the following guidelines for park use.
 - Follow CDC's guidance on personal hygiene prior to heading to parks and trails — wash hands, carry hand sanitizer, do not use parks or trails if you have symptoms, cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing, etc.
 - Observe at all times CDC's minimum recommended social distancing of six feet from other people. Practice it and know what it looks like. Keep it as you walk, bike or hike.
 - Warn other trail users of your presence and as you pass to allow proper distance and step off trails to allow others to pass, keeping minimum recommended distances at all times. Signal your presence with your voice, bell or horn.
 - Note that trail and park users may find public restrooms closed — be prepared before you leave and time outings so that you are not dependent on public restrooms.
 - Bring water or drinks — public drinking fountains may be disabled and should not be used, even if operable
 - Bring a suitable trash bag. Leave no trash, take everything out to protect park workers
- The Cherokee Family Violence 24/7 Hotline number is 770-479-1703 for English and 770-720-7050 for Spanish. The Cherokee Family Violence Center is providing emergency shelter for victims of domestic violence and assisting with emergency protection orders M-F 9am-5pm.
- The William G. Long Senior Center will remain closed until further notice.
- CATS has resumed on-demand services on Tuesdays and Thursday for grocery store and pharmaceutical trips. Clients should call CATS to schedule those trips. Social distancing requirements and sanitation protocols on all buses will continue. Service to the Senior Center, Empower Cherokee and other high risk facilities will remain closed until further notice.
- The Courts of the Blue Ridge Judicial Circuit and Cherokee County will continue to operate under the Judicial Emergency Order governing operations of the Courts of this State. The

Courts will remain open to address essential functions as provided under the Judicial Emergency Order.

The citizens of Cherokee County are resilient and have always stepped up to meet any challenge. We are all in this together!

Cherokee EMA will continue to provide the latest information as it is provided by the Georgia Department of Public Health, CDC, and other partnering agencies.

PREVENTATIVE MEASURES

- Wash your hands often with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick
- If you are sick, please contact your primary care physician.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Practice social distancing
- Receive a flu vaccination
- All residents of Georgia are encouraged to have a plan in place to care for and protect family members who are elderly or have compromised immune systems. Check on neighbors who may be elderly or have a heightened risk of contracting the virus.
- We encourage citizens of the county to use take out or delivery options at restaurants.
