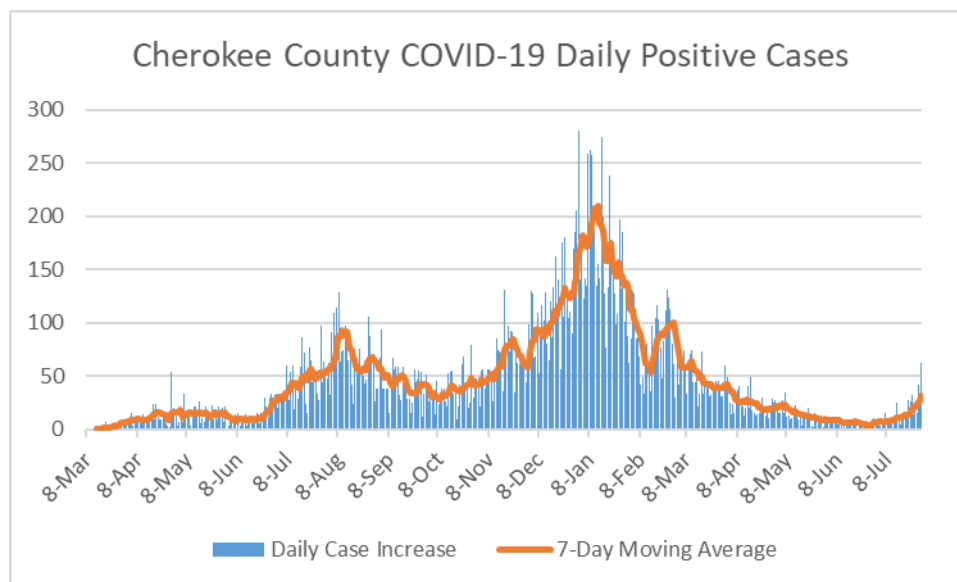


**CHEROKEE COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

DAILY UPDATE

- Cherokee County EMA and Board of Commissioners ask that you be mindful of your needed travels, contact with others, continue to practice social distancing, and practice good hygiene.
- The Georgia Department of Public Health has announced 929,614 confirmed cases of COVID-19 across the state.
- 18,699 deaths have occurred in the state as a result of COVID-19.
- Cherokee County has 23,316 confirmed cases of COVID-19, since March 8, 2020. This is an increase of 63 cases from the previous day.
- Cherokee County has three hundred and twenty (320) confirmed fatalities due to COVID-19.



***** COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic Location*****

- The COVID-19 vaccination clinics are located at the Public Health Department centers in Canton and Woodstock. To make an appointment, please call the Canton Public Health Center (1219 Univeter Road, Canton, GA) at 770-345-7371 or the Woodstock Public Health Center (7545 North Main Street, Woodstock, GA) at 770-329-0133.
 - **ALL Georgian's aged 12 and older are eligible for the vaccine.**
 - To make an appointment online with Georgia DPH, eligible residents should register via:

- Every Tuesday, Georgia Public Health will offer a Family Night COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic at the Canton Health Department location. The address is 1219 Univeter Road, Canton, GA, 30115. Hours for this event will be 4:00 pm until 6:00 pm. No appointment is needed.

*****NEW COVID-19 drive-thru testing location*****

- COVID-19 testing is located in the parking lot of Action Church (271 Marietta Road, Canton, GA, 30114). Hours of operations and pre-registration processes are listed below:
 - Days/Hours of Operation: Monday-Friday from 8:00 AM until 3:00 PM
 - It is highly recommended that you pre-register for your test at the following link <https://mako.exchange/splash/GAmakotesting/>
 - Please do not call the church or enter the church buildings.

PREVENTATIVE MEASURES

- Wash your hands often with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick
- If you are sick, please contact your primary care physician.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Practice social distancing
- Receive a flu vaccination
- All residents of Georgia are encouraged to have a plan in place to care for and protect family members who are elderly or have compromised immune systems. Check on neighbors who may be elderly or have a heightened risk of contracting the virus.
- We encourage citizens of the county to use take out or delivery options at restaurants.
